THIS IS THE INTRODUCTORY ISSUE of a quarterly news letter devoted to the publication of genealogical and historical data, as well as current news, of the Morford family.

Many to whom this complimentary issue is being sent know the editor as a professional genealogist, who for thirty years has been compiling and sharing information of this family, of which her husband is a descendant through his paternal grandmother. The result is probably one of the largest and best documented collections of Morford data to be found anywhere. It is hoped that by publishing information of the incomplete lines, additional data will be located through contacts with those who have gathered records of their own families. "MORFORDS OF AMERICA" is the title chosen for what is now but a gleam in the eye and a dream in the heart of the Morford Historian-- an entire set of books, each relating to the history of one or more branches of the Morford family. These genealogical records will be augmented by pictures of the early Morfords in each branch, plus facsimiles of Morford Bible records, and other documents of interest. Commencing on page 4 of this issue are lists of hundreds of the descendants who have furnished family records to us. These lists have a double purpose -- first, to thank these correspondents, and second, to enable all readers to check the lists seeking to find relatives, and thus learn to which branch of the family they belong. Please do this, and let us know where you fit into the Morford family tree. If no familiar names are found, write and let us know the names, dates and locations of births, marriages and deaths, of your parents, also your grandparents -- more than likely we can tell you the names of their ancestors!

"SIXTY-FIVE SPELLINGS FOR MORFORD" were discussed in an article written by the Morford Historian in 1962. Since then, the quantity of known spelling variants has more than doubled! True, not all of the variations always pertain to Morfords --- but documents have been found in which the name was spelled three different ways! As many pioneers frequently were unable to write, the clerk who recorded the marriage or the lawyer who drew up the will or deed spelled the name "by ear". The softened and slurred southern speech produced such variants as MOFFARD or MOFFORD. In one Kentucky family the grandfather insisted on the latter spelling. But, guess what?? Recently his granddaughter acquired an early tintype of him, in Civil War uniform, on the back of which, in his own handwriting the signature was MORFORD!! The tradition is that this branch, which

supported the Union side in the conflict, wanted to repudiate all relationship to Maj. John D. Morford of Bracken County, who was a slaveholder; thus the change of spelling.

Earliest records in New Jersey show many spellings pertaining to the Morford family. Among these were: MAERFOOT, MAURFOOT, MOFFORD, MORFETT, MORFFORD, MORFIT, MORFOOT, MORFOT, MORPHET, MORTFORD and MURFOORD. If you think that's confusing, read on!

For example, let's check through one family's records. Cornelius Morford [1741-1825], who married Hester Brian in 1761 in Burlington County, N.J., moved to Salem County by 1774, and while usually shown in tax ratable lists as MORFORD, is found as MAUFORD in 1784 and 1785; in the 1793 Militia Census he is "Cornelos MEFFERD", but his son was "Cornelous MOFOURD Jr." In an 1801 deed, just before he moved with his family to St. George's Hundred, New Castle County, Delaware, the name appears as MORFORD and MOLFORD His, son Isaac, who died in 1817 in Appoquinimink Hundred, New Castle County, Delaware, was shown variously as MORFORT, MOFFARD and MOFFORD. Isaac's widow, Barbara, is shown on an 1825 tax list as "Barbary MAUPHET", with sons Cornelos and Isaack. Another son of Isaac Sr., Frederick [1788-1851], was called MORFERD in the 1820 census of Wayne Co., Ohio; appeared as MOFFRED in the 1830 census of Holmes Co., Ohio, and as MORFIT in the 1840 census of Madison Co., Ohio. Next Frederick moved to Illinois, where the 1850 census of DeWitt County shows his name as MORFRET.

Frederick's eldest son, Abraham S. [1814-1881] was recorded as MOFORD at his marriage, MONFORD in a later census record. The second son, Frederick Jr. [1816-1885] was shown as MOFFERT on his marriage record. Isaac [1820-96], third son, was called MOFFORD in his newspaper obituary, but the cemetery plot which he had bought, and in which he was buried, was recorded as belonging to "I. MUNFORD". The fourth son, John [1821-1875], was found as MOFFAT in the 1850 census of DeWitt County, Ill. The fifth son, Robert, [1825-1867] was living with his parents in 1850, thus appears in the MORFRET spelling; while Wesley [1828-1902], the youngest son, was called MOREFORD in his Civil War pension file. Robert's grandson, Robert Harris Morford [1881-1957], for reasons known only to himself, changed his surname to MOFFETT. [Did he know something we don't. about the early family -- or was he just an individualist?]

So, here are a total of 20 variant spellings appearing in a single branch of Morfords, within a five-generation span! The lesson to be learned here is that we must never be adamant in demanding that the name must be spelled in what we consider the "correct" way, in all the early records; nor must we ever declare that these spelling variations cannot pertain to our family. They CAN, and they DO!

WERE THE MORFORDS ORIGINALLY OF SCOTLAND? IRELAND? ENGLAND? WALES? FRANCE? As yet, we have no *proofe* of any of these. The strongest tradition is that of Scottish heritage; this does not necessarily eliminate Ireland as a former homeland, because in the days of the persecution of Protestants by "Bloody Queen Mary" of England, many of the Scots fled to the province of Ulster, in northern Ireland, where they could maintain their Presbyterian faith. Those refugees soon became known as "Scotch-Irish", but were not of Irish ancestry. Emigration to England and Wales came later, before the days when the more venturesome ones took ship for America, the land of promise.

RELIGIOUS AFFILIATIONS? Some Morfords were Baptists, some Episcopalians, some Quakers or Friends, some Presbyterians; later we find Methodists and Latter-day Saints (known as Mormons), to name some of their preferences. Early New Jersey records of baptisms in the Dutch Reformed Church have been noted; this does not necessarily imply that the parents were members of that church, but simply that baptisms were performed in whichever church was convenient. Incidentally, this resulted in some peculiar variations of the Morford name, such as, MARFOET and MAERFOET -- probably the closest the Dutch "dominie" could come in his efforts to spell "Morford"!



AS WE PLAN TO PUBLISH Morfords' pictures in the MORFORD HISTORIAN, it seems appropriate that the first person to be honored should be Harold's grandmother, Margaret Morford, born 16 October 1858 in McLean, McLean Co., Illinois, daughter of John and Mary "Polly" (Cullumber) Morford. Her history appears in considerable detail in our book, *Ancestors and Descendants of Jeremiah Adams 1794-1883*, published in 1974, which in 1977 received the prestigious Donald Lines Jacobus award from the Society of American Genealogists, as the best family genealogy published within a five-year period.

Maggie, as she was called, had an affectionate and warmly compassionate nature, and her welcome to me as a bride coming into the Adams family endeared her to me forever. She it was who gave me the first records, from memory, of the Morford and Cullumber families, and it is our hope that this news- and subsequent publications on both families, may be deemed as worthwhile and lasting tributes to her memory.

A WORD OF APPRECIATION is due to several long-time correspondents who have generously shared

Morford records, and whose encouragement has been an inspiration to me in the lengthy and continuing task of identifying and tying together the early records. One of the first was <u>Edward J. Raser</u> of the Genealogical Society of New Jersey, who noted and answered my Morford queries in the Hartford Times 25 years ago, and who, throughout the years since then, has consistently sent me bits of Morford data, names and addresses, and other helpful information gleaned in his travels or his own research.

Miriam Morford Peterson, of my "home town", Seattle, Washington, a descendant of the "Greene County, Pa." Morfords, has shared results of her intensive research and study in several Iowa counties where her ancestors and their cousins settled after leaving Pennsylvania. Her keenly analytical study of clues has made it possible to identify parentage of many early Iowa Morford groups formerly considered as "unknowns".

Joe Allen Morford of Parkersburg, West Virginia, another "Greene Co. Pa." descendant, has "corresponded" with the Morford Historian for some time, via cassette tapes, each the equivalent of a 10-page letter, full of interviews with relatives and his own recollections of family traditions and events, spiced with a delightful sense of humor. Joe has the distinction of being the first subscriber to MORFORD HISTORIAN, having the faith to send in his check when he first learned of the project. Hope this first issue will measure up to your expectations, Joe!

<u>Golda Morford</u>, formerly of Michigan and California, now living in Clearwater, Florida, with her sister Cyretta, has corresponded with almost as many Morford descendants of numerous branches as are listed in this issue of MORFORD HISTORIAN. Like the editor, Golda first started to work on her own branch, but soon extended her interest to all branches of Morfords. Her own line, the "Mercer County, Pa." branch, has now been proven back to one of the first two Morfords found in New Jersey -- John' and his wife Margaret, who were first of Monmouth County, but who in 1710 moved to Middlesex County, settling in the village of Cranbury.

OTHERS WHO HAVE GIVEN SPECIAL HELP include: Russ Gunder of Washington, Ind., who, with his wife and son spent an entire day in a state library copying all 1850 Ohio census records of Morford and its variations, and men of other surnames who had married Morford girls in Ohio prior to 1850; Wally 0. Deer of Cincinnati, Ohio, who tape-recorded his reading of the Barton collection on Morford and Mofford families of Kentucky, and sent the cassette tape to the Historian; Viola Neeb of Shelbyville, Ind., who has sent a great many obituaries and other items from an old scrapbook of items pertaining to Bracken County, Ky. families, as well as some Ohio and Indiana records; Ruby Boman, of Wichita, Kansas, who has shared results of her census and courthouse research in Mercer Co., Pa. and other places; Alfred Morford, formerly of Castana, Iowa, now of Marysville, California, who collected records of branches other than the Mercer Co., Pa. group of which. he is a descendant; Audrey (Mrs. Arno) Morford, of Alhambra, California, who sent me a revised and updated mimeographed copy of the 1892 Morford book gives records of the "Mercer Co. Pa." Morfords. Last, but by no means least, are my two daughters: Peggy, who spent most of one summer "traipsing" through county courthouses in Washington, Oregon and northern Idaho, helping me copy Morford marriage data; and Nancy, who with her daughter Merry Lynne Elliott spent much time checking records of Warren County, Ohio, where Cornelius Morford Sr. and Jr. finally settled; and who let us use her car on our 1978 research trip to many Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky courthouses. And finally, my husband Harold, who for many years has backed me up in all of my genealogical endeavors and now the publication of the MORFORD HISTORIAN, in which he has a star role as advisor, critic, photographer and printer.

THANKS ARE ALSO EXPRESSED to hundreds of Morford descendants of various branches whose sharing of their records has made it possible during the past 25 years to extend our knowledge of a large proportion of early Morford groups who, both before and after the Revolutionary War, migrated from New Jersey into Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, New York, Virginia, Kentucky, Ohio, Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa, Illinois, Kansas, Tennessee, West Virginia. IF YOU RECOGNIZED ANY RELATIVES in the foregoing lists of our correspondents, then you know, at least, the earliest ancestor in your lineage. But if you are missing some of the in-between generations, let us know the earliest ancestor you now know, and it is very likely we can help you complete your records. Be sure to mention the dates of birth, and the places where your parents, grandparents and great-grandparents resided. (Please enclose self-addressed, stamped envelope for our use in answering your letter.)

To help you further, our next issue will feature names, dates and spouses of Morfords born between 1870 and 1880. Most readers will surely find therein names of parents, uncles and aunts, or grandparents, great-uncles, great-aunts - depending, of course, on the age of the reader. Here's a sample of the records as they will appear:

William Perry Morford 1873-Edward Harvey Morford 1875-1927 Ethan Everett Morford 1877-1939 married Nora B. Potter married Cora B. Dobbins married Maude A. Kelsey VERY LITTLE HAS APPEARED IN PRINT about the Morford family. In 1892 a 24-page booklet entitled *History of the Morford Family*, signed by "C.R.M." of South New Lyme, Ohio, was printed by Shenango Valley News-Print, Greenville, Pa. The author was Curtis Richard Morford [1856-1944], son of Isaac and Celestia Lysetta (Williams) Morford, and a grandson of John Morford [1758-18401, the younger of two great-grandsons of the John Morford of Middletown, Monmouth Co., NJ and Cranbury, Middlesex Co., NJ. The booklet begins with Thomas' Morford [1716-1797] and his wife Ann, whose dates of birth and death are given, but not her maiden name, which we know to be "Lawrie". It is likely that Curtis R. Morford had access to a Morford family Bible, inasmuch as very specific birthdates are quoted. The statement was made that Thomas and Ann had been born in Scotland and Ireland, respectively; but, at least as to Thomas, this was an error, for he was a grandson of John' Morford who was of New Jersey as early as 1676, when he had a grant of 120 acres of land in Middletown. Although this Morford history mentions a few locations in the first few pages of introductory material, it was quite deficient in the remaining 17 pages, which gave only names and dates, no places. Nevertheless, the booklet was a fairly good starting point for more meticulous genealogists to put together a record of the two sons of Thoma S3 who established the "Mercer County, Pa." branch of the family -- James Morford 1753-1809, and John Morford 1758-1840.

SOME TIME BEFORE 1916, a Mrs. Silas Shepherd of New Jersey compiled a record (whether in book or manuscript form has not been learned), in which was contained some data as to the Thomas Morford who married, in 1752, in New Jersey, Esther Bowne, daughter of Samue 13 and Esther Bowne. [See page 25, "WILLIAM BOWNE OF YORKSHIRE, ENGLAND AND HIS DESCENDANTS", by Miller K. Reading, M.D., published in Flemington, N.J. in 1902 under copyright of H. E. Deats.] Efforts to locate a copy of Mrs. Shepherd's manuscript or book have thus far been unsuccessful. If anyone knows the exact title and can inform us as to where a copy may be consulted, please write the MORFORD HISTORIAN.

In Volume IV, *Historical and Genealogical Miscellany, Early Settlers of New Jersey and Their Descendants*, published 1916 by Dr. John Stillwell, several comments indicate he was quoting from Mrs. Shepherd's data. In the 11 pages on "Morfords of Monmouth Co." only 9 lines pertain to John¹ Morford; Dr. Stillwell apparently was not aware that in 1710 John had sold his Middletown land and purchased land in Cranbury, Middlesex Co, N.J. Neither the section on Monmouth Co. Morfords, nor the 1½ page section entitled "Miscellaneous Notes", gives adequate coverage of all early Morfords of New Jersey.

Except for the compilations mentioned above, other published Morford records consist mainly of biographies in county histories, not all of which are notable for accuracy. One reason is that members of the family not purchasing a copy of the history were often omitted from mention; thus a comprehensive view of the family group is not shown. From time to time the MORFORD HISTORIAN will quote some of these biographies, and will cite proofs from sources such as wills, deeds, census and other public records, showing the true facts as compared with statements made in the biographical sketches. One of the aims of the MORFORD HISTORIAN will be to publish any corrections necessary in order to set straight the history of the Morford family.

PUBLISHED BIBLE RECORDS of some Morford families, however, are generally dependable if the information came from first-hand knowledge and was not copied from some uninformed source. One record, published in May 1977 in *THE GENEALOGICAL MAGAZINE OF NEW JERSEY*, under the title "Three Morford Family Bibles", was transcribed by Mrs. Harold L. Adams from photostatic copies of the originals. Those wishing copies may write to the Corresponding Secretary, Genealogical Society of New Jersey, P.O. We have several other Morford Bible records which we plan to publish, thus preserving for all descendants records which, in the original, can be owned by only one person or family at a time. Do you have Bible records showing Morford names? If so, please share them with our readers by sending us photocopies of the record pages, also of the title page of the Bible.

HONORING A 5th-GREAT GRANDFATHER, born in 1740, and a 4th-GREAT GRANDFATHER born 1766, the youngest son of the Charles I. Morford family of Davenport, Iowa, born 18 December 1979, was named Daniel James Morford. His earliest proven paternal ancestor, Daniel Morford, was born in New Jersey in 1740 and served in the Revolutionary War. Later he lived in Kentucky and Ohio, where he died in 1833. Daniel's son James Morford 1766-1839, headed the branch of the family known as the "Greene Co. Pa." Morfords. Young Dan's father is the compiler of Vol. I, Biographical Index to the County Histories of Iowa, published in 1979. Charles is now working on Vol. II, also on a book of early Iowa marriages.

MRS. NELLIE E. RITTER MORFORD, wife of Basil Morford of Indianapolis, died on Monday, 18 February 1980, at the age of 92. Survivors besides her husband are sons Bruce and Irvin, and a daughter Thelma Schutt. The Morfords had celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in October 1971. Basil is a 2d-great grandson of John and Susannah (Hess) Morford of Clermont County, Ohio, and Franklin County, Indiana. For a number of years this family has held reunions of the descendants of William and Nancy (Lewis) Morford. It was not until the Morford Historian's research trip in 1978 that data came to light revealing John and Susannah (Hess) Morford as William's parents.
