LOST GRAVE MARKER OF REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER TO BE REPLACED

"Gravestone lost, burial place unknown" --- what discouraging words to the descendants trying to locate their ancestor's grave!

Our subscriber John Bell Morford, of Kinsman, Ohio, a great-great grandson of the Revolutionary War soldier JOHN MORFORD [1758-1840], who was also a pioneer settler in Mercer County, Pennsylvania, wrote recently to tell us that in a history of Mercer Co. it had been stated that John Morford had been buried in the Baptist Cemetery in Sharon, Pa. Some years ago, when a new Baptist Church replaced the original one, the remains of those persons formerly interred in the old Baptist Church Cemetery were removed to Oakwood Cemetery, at 600 North Oakland Avenue, in Sharon. Unfortunately, in the process of the move, the original stone marking the burial place of John Morford was lost, and now the present caretakers are unable to determine the site of the grave.

However, plans are in the making for a memorial marker to be placed in Oakwood Cemetery, on a family plot in which is buried the Revolutionary soldier's fourth son, John Morford [1796-1877], and the latter's son, Vanransler Vance Morford [1827-1903]. Permission has been given by Vanransler's grandson, Merle Asbury Morford, and by Merle's daughter Beatrice (Morford) Bell, for placement of the marker, which will be furnished by the U. S. Government at no cost; the only expense will be the actual charges for having the marker set in place by cemetery employees.

The latter charges will probably amount to somewhere between \$40. and \$50. The Morford Historian suggests that a donation of only \$1. each from living descendants of the soldier would take care of this expense, and any surplus amount donated could appropriately be placed in the "research kitty" to help trace the ancestral line in England. On pages 142, 143 and 144 of this issue are shown three generations (sons, grandsons and great-grandsons) of the Revolutionary soldier's descendants. Female descendants were not listed because only a handful of our subscribers are of surnames other than Morford. Each reader should be able to recognize his grandfather or great-grandfather in this list. If a death-date or location, or full name of spouse is missing, please help us complete the record by sending the missing data when you mail your contribution. We suggest that you check through this list, then communicate with your cousins to tell them of this memorial project, so that each of them may also participate in the effort; or, send us their names and addresses and we'll mail each a copy of this issue.

It is hoped that arrangements for this memorial may be completed in time for the marker to be in place by Memorial Day, Monday the 30th of May 1984. Descendants living near enough might wish to gather there on that day for a reunion. Donations should be sent to the MORFORD HISTORIAN, who will see that funds for setting the marker are forwarded to John Morford of Kinsman, Ohio, who will make arrangements with Oakwood Cemetery.

If you know of other MORFORD veterans of the Revolutionary War, or other wars, whose burial places are known but unmarked, send us the veteran's name, dates of service, and burial place, and we'll coordinate efforts to have each such grave suitably marked.

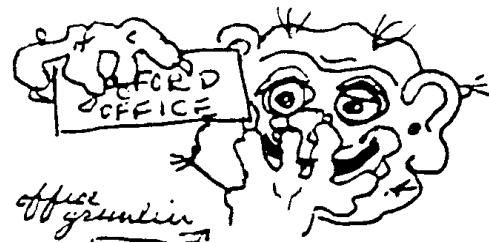

ANOTHER MYSTERY SOLVED!

WE NEEDED A BRIEF ARTICLE to fit on this page, and in the process came across a record which seems to belong to the second listed great-grandson at the bottom of page 142--- a B. Franklin Morford, born 1830, son of Elias and Rebecca (Spencer) Morford . Census records for 1880, 1900 and 1910 show a Benjamin F. Morford, age 49, born Ohio, living in Pct. #72, Ellis Co., TX, with wife Mary, 42, born PA; children were James W. 21, b.OH; Elmer L. 16, Essington 13, and Minnie 10, all born in PA; and a daughter Chloa, 1, born in Texas. The third son, "Essie" married about 1890 to Belle, and in 1900 this couple was of Clarendon, Donley Co., TX, with 2 daughters: Allie, c1892 and a daughter whose name was not shown, born in August 1898. She may have been the Mable, age 9 of the same family in 1910 with others of the family being Joe 1901, Loyd 1903, James L. 1905, and Kidd, age 1 month (born about March 1910). We'd like to hear from any descendants of this particular family.

HERE'S THE CULPRIT!

AT LAST, the Historian has learned who is responsible for typographical errors found in some of our articles. We present here the portrait of our office gremlin, produced by the facile pen of one of our subscribers, Sarah Hammel. One of the recent pranks of this gleeful fiend was to place the town of Washington in Bracken County, Kentucky, when it really is in Mason County. That happened on page 78 of the April '82 issue. And in that same issue, on page 74, "Grem" called Sarah's ancestor "Thomas", instead of Thompson Patterson. Again, just last October, he managed to get the birth year of "Moff" (see page 132) a whole hundred years too late -- "1981" instead of "1881". Now that's going a bit too far, "Grem", old boy! Kindly behave yourself or you'll be fired.



Incidentally, "Moff" has been identified by our subscriber Mary Alice (Mrs. Preston) Leach, of Stanford, KY., as the sister-in-law of Mary Alice's grandfather, James Clarence Morford [1883-1964]. Moff's husband was the late Walter Garfield Morford. Her maiden name was Curd, and she was first married to a Mr. Bell whose given name we haven't learned. She was born 22 October 1881, and died not too long after having celebrated her 101st birthday in 1982. Walter and Lucy had no children.

A NEW TWIG ON THE MORFORD FAMILY TREE

MELISSA VENA MORFORD, daughter of Gregory Leroy and Vena Lee (Thompson) Morford, was born 23 July 1983, at Placerville, CA. With her parents, she is temporarily living at the home of Ben & Betty Morford, her paternal grandparents, in Grizzly Flats, CA. Greg was graduated from medical school in El Paso, Texas; is now waiting to get a residency at a hospital. IS THERE AN "AMERICUS" MORFORD IN YOUR ANCESTRAL LINE?

The Americus we're interested in was living, in 1860, at the age of 28, in Jefferson Township, Mercer Co. , Ohio; had a wife Eliza, 24, a son Finley age 7, and a daughter Mary, age 4. Americus appears to have had a stepfather named Joseph Lieber, who was of Butler Co. , Ohio, in 1850, with a wife Jane, age 42, who was probably the mother of Americus Morford. Who was the Morford who was Jane's first husband?

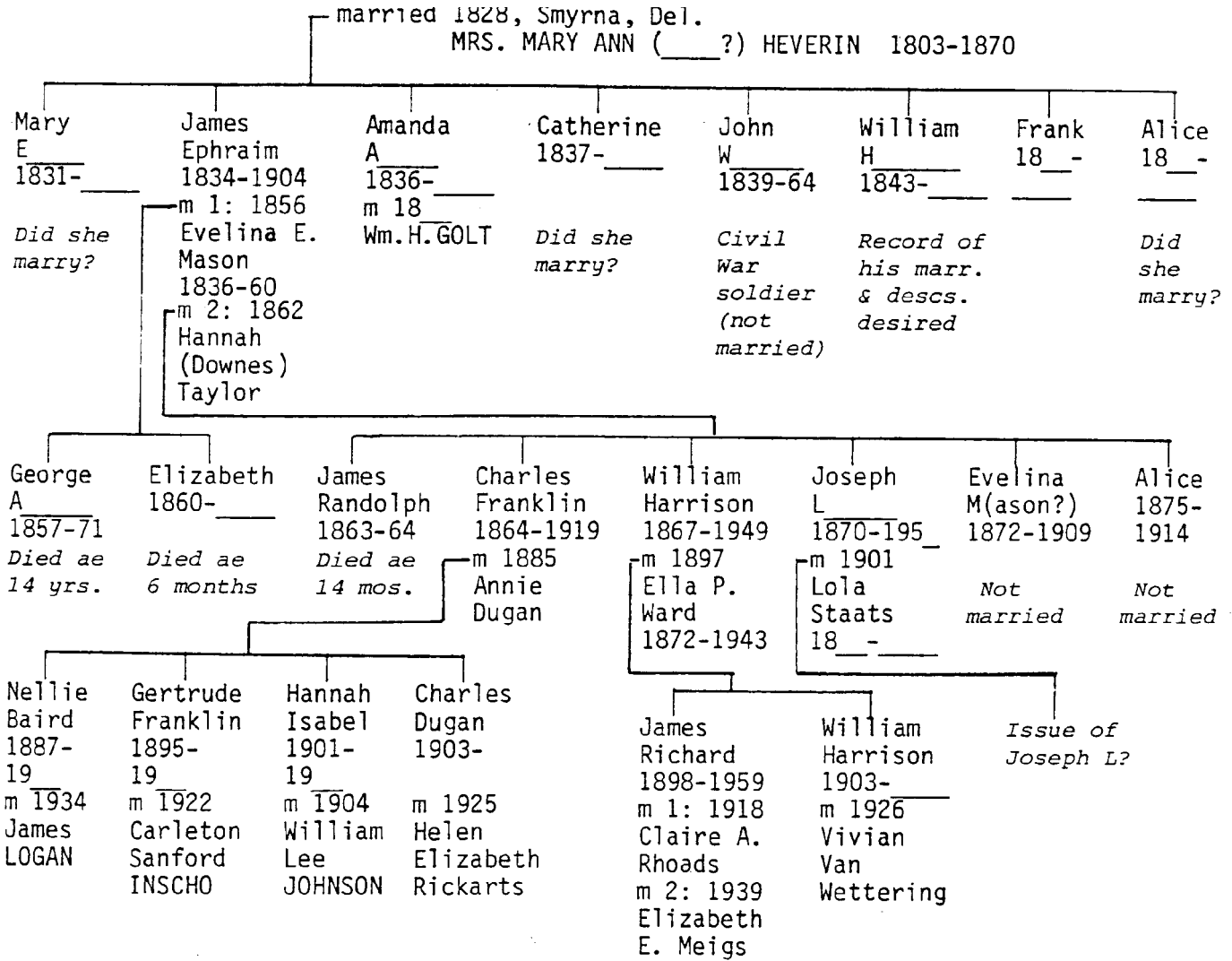
The son Finley, we learned from later research and correspondence with a person who knew a family member, was actually Ralph Finley Morford, born June 1853 in Ohio; he married Addie E. McCarthy. Besides his sister Mary, there was another younger one named Ella, who married a Mr. Hitchcock, and a younger brother, Luke Morford..

Ralph Finley Morford was living in Mt. Ayr, Ringgold Co. , Iowa in 1900 with his wife Addie, who was born in August 1868 in Illinois. Their known children were: Evla (b. 1888, md. Lloyd Carsrud; Beverly (d. in infancy); Fern L. 1892 (md. Emmett Butts); Hazel J. [1896-1903]; Clarence Earl [1898-1962: md. 1st 1920 Marqaret Rose Bierd, 2d, Ruth McLean]; and Roe, 1900, who lived in Oceanside, California, about the 1960s. The Historian has been in touch with a son of Clarence E. , but would. like to hear from other descendants who could fill in the gaps in our records of this family.

Was JRM's son William H. Morford the one listed as William Moffot in the 1880 census of Black Bird Hundred, NewCastle Co., Del., with wife Lidia A., born about 1854, and a son Walter C., born 1879?

About 1962 a family Bible containing records from the earliest name on this page down to the great-grandchildren of James Randolph Morford, was in the possession of Hannah Isabel (Morford) Johnson [wife or widow of William Lee Johnson]; she was then living at 7946 Mitchner Avenue, Philadelphia, PA. NEWS OF MORFORDS AND THEIR DESCENDANTS

FRANK RAYMOND MORFORD, 75, of 6890 Fairway Avenue, S.E. , Salem, Ore. , died there on Tuesday, April, 1981. He was the second child and only son of James Raymond and Carrie Lula (Abbott) Morford, and was born 19 August 1907 in Spokane, Washington. His elder sister, Mildred Abbott (Morford) Steffer, died in 1931; his younger sister, Clara Morford, is living in St. Paul, Minn. Frank had been a personnel supervisor for Pacific Telephone Company, retiring in 1970 after 42 years with the company; he came to Salem from Olympia, Washington, about 1977. Survivors included his wife, Marian E., of Salem; a daughter, Delores Watt of Brunswick, Maine, and his sister Clara; also 4 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. DONALD THOMAS, of Florence, Oregon, died 16 August 1981 at Eugene, OR. Born September 1 , 1922 , he was the elder son of Ishmel L. and Alice L. E. DR. ROBERT MORFORD BRUCE, born 11 May 1909 in Onaway, MI, died 23 September 1983 at Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, aged 74. He was the son of Dr. Robert Franklin and Hattie (Morford) Bruce, and nephew of Golda and Cyretta Morford of Clearwater. Florida.. Memorial services were held 29 September 1983, followed by cremation. His mother's line: *Cyrus Templeton⁸ William⁷ Richard⁶ John⁵ Thomas⁴ Thomas³ John² John¹ Morford*

RECORDS OF A "LOST" MORFORD FAMILY

IN THE 1892 *HISTORY OF THE MORFORD FAMILY* only brief mention is made of William Morford, son of James and Ann (Clawson) Morford. He is named third among their children but no birthyear, death year, marriage date or name of spouse is recorded. "William settled near home (i.e., Mercer Co. PA). He built a hewed log-house and barn; it was considered the finest residence in that section of the country. He also owned a sawmill. Later he left Mercer County, and all trace of him and his family is lost."

But, two books published in the same decade furnish clues as to his wife's name, and the place to which she and William had moved. In *PIONEER WOMEN OF THE WESTERN RESERVE* (1896), page 497 says: "Coming (to Chagrin Falls, Cuyahoga Co.) Ohio, from Brookfield, Trumbull Co. , Ohio in 1836, a widow with three daughters, was Elizabeth Bentley Morford who was very skillful with her needle." And in *BENTLEY FAMILY, WITH GENEALOGICAL RECORD OF OHIO BENTLEYS & KNOWN AS THE TRIBE OF BENJAMIN*, by Roeliff Brinkerhoff, in 1897 (a 20-pp. booklet), it is learned that during the Colonial period one George Bentley, drafted into English service, came to America as a member of the Royal troops; after the war he settled in Chester Co. , Pa. , where he married Jane Carson, a native of Ireland, and had: Sheshbazzar, House, Jeffrey, Absolom, Mary, Benjamin, Margaret, and Joseph. In 1810 Benjamin Bentley (who had married Mary Baldwin) was living with his family in Mercer Co. , Pa. , near the present site of Sharon, and from there moved to the adjoining county of Trumbull, Ohio, where he located upon a farm and remained until his death, Sept. 23, 1818. The third child of Benjamin and Mary is listed as Elizabeth Bentley, born 12 July 1787, death date not given, who married Wm. Morford. [We suggest that grantor deeds in Mercer Co. Pa. , and grantee deeds in Trumbull Co. OH might tell us just when William and his wife left Mercer Co. to go to Ohio.]

William Morford evidently died between 1816 (birthyear of his 3d daughter, Phoebe) and 1820, as the census for the latter year for Brookfield Twp., Trumbull Co., Oh., shows Elizabeth Morford and 3 daughters; she was again listed there in 1830. She had two daughters born between 1810 and 1815, one born between 1815 and 1820. Later census records show this youngest daughter to have been Phoebe, born about 1816 in Ohio; she married first, 1844, Abraham Drake, and after he died, married John Haven, a widower born in 1795, who had a daughter Sophronia, born about 1841. The 1860 census shows Sophronia Drake, and Phoebe's youngest daughter Hattie Drake (born about 1845), and Phoebe's mother Elizabeth C. Morford, age 73, living with John and Phoebe (Morford) (Drake) Haven. A search of cemetery records of Shalersville, Portage Co., Ohio, might reveal Elizabeth's date of death.

William Morford's eldest daughter, Mary Ann, born about 1808, married, August 1825, Obadiah Hull, and had 11 children: Aholiab 1826, Amaziah 1827, Elizabeth 1829, Japheth 1831, Jasper 1833, Benjamin F. 1836, Almira 1837 (m. James McFarland), Phoebe 1839 (m. Mr. Hunt), Mary Ann 1843 (m. 1867 Henry N. Clement), Emily 1845 (m. Sam'l. Pettit) and Obadiah Jr. 1849 (m. twice: Elizabeth Horner, and Miranda Clark). Mary Ann Morford and Obadiah Hull were of Mahaska County, Iowa, at the time of their marriage.

The Morfords' second daughter, Hannah, born 17 April 1811 in Solon, Cuyahoga Co.,OH, married 20 October 1842, as his second wife, Alexander Edson Kent, son of Gamaliel and Deborah (Huntington) Kent.. By 1850 they had 4 children: Abiah Arabella 1843 (who died shortly before her 10th birthday); Alexander Gamaliel 1845; Alice Cassandra 1846 (who married 1866 Lucas Hurd); and Henry Martyn Kent, born 1848.

Third and youngest daughter, Phoebe Morford, born 1816, married as his 2d wife, in 1844, Abraham Drake, by whom she had a daughter Harriet, born 1845. Abraham died by 1860; the census of that year shows Phebe as wife of John Haven, born 1795.

A PROBABLE EARLY MARRIAGE OF A MORFORD GIRL TO A MR. DYE

WERE THERE INTERMARRIAGES between the early DYE (Dey, Day) family of New Jersey, and the MORFORD family? This is a question which intrigues not only the Morford Historian, but Martie (Mrs. R. H.) Cook, of Winnetka, IL, who had a Dye ancestor with the name of MOFFETT (or MORFETT) DYE. That is not the only interesting fact about this ancestor. He was of Washington, County, Ohio. Was it mere coincidence that the obituary for John Morford [1713-1812] of New Jersey, later of Bucks County, PA., and of Philadelphia at the time of his death, was reprinted in a newspaper of Marietta, Washington Co., Ohio? [See pages 41 and 42 of the July 1981 MORFORD HISTORIAN.] We invite readers with further information on this probable connection of the Dye and Morford families, to share their data with us, so that this problem may be solved.

We'd like to point out that the surnames of the earliest Morfords' wives have not yet been discovered: Margaret, wife of John Morford [c1650-c1730]; Susanna, wife of Thomas Morford [165_ -1695/6]; Rebecca, wife of Thomas the elder son of John Morford of Middlesex Co. , N..J. ; and Abigail , wife of John Morford Jr. , another of the sons of the first John Morford of New Jersey. Potential families from which these four Mesdames Morford may have come include not only the Dye family, but Applegate, Job and Mount. [Are there any experts on these families among our readers?]

HELP NEEDED!

Who can identify the MRS. A. R. MORFORD of San Francisco, who married second, as his second wife, EVERETT LEVI REXFORD, who was born in Chautauqua County, N.Y. on 24 Apr. 1842? The marriage probably took place in San Francisco, where the Rev. Dr. Everett L. Rexford held a pastorage, probably of the Universalist Church. Perhaps some San Francisco reader could search for the marriage application, which ought to show the bride's given name, as well as her former maiden surname, and the full name of her first husband.

We have also had an inquiry for the parentage, brothers and sisters, of the SUSAN VanGESEL who was married, in 1826, in NewCastle County, Delaware, to ISAAC MORFORD. We would like to know if there is a published VanGESEL history which might have this information. None is mentioned in *GENEALOGIES IN THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS*; but perhaps some library may have a manuscript genealogy of this seemingly rare surname.

CLORE is also a rare name; but there is a Gaines Genealogy in the Library of Congress (CS71.G142) which does have a sketch of the Michael Clore family. Can someone tell us if it shows the marriage, 24 January 1836, in Boone County, KY., of a GABRIEL CLORE to MALINDA MOFFORD? and if so, are the parents of either or both identified?

From Delma C. McCourt, a volunteer assistant in the Jefferson County, OH. Historical Association, in Steubenville, we learned about the burial of a JOSEPH MOFFET, at the age of 50, in 1888; and of JANE MOFFET (apparently his wife), buried in 1887 at the age of 43. These two burials, and others originally in the downtown area of Steubenville, were moved into a pioneer plot in Union Cemetery when it was opened. If any reader can identify this couple, please let Morford Historian know who they were.

Who was the JAMES MORFORD who in December 1967 was a member of Odd Fellows Park City Lodge No. 606, Council Bluffs, Iowa?

MORE ABOUT SUSAN (MORFORD) AGY, OF PITTSBURGH, PENNSYLVANIA

WE ARE STILL PURSUING records of the AGY family of Pittsburgh, PA [see pages 62 and 63 of MORFORD HISTORIAN for January 1982]. In the 1910 census Susan Agy was listed as a widow; thus we knew that her husband, John M. Agy, must have died between 1900 and 1910. A search by the staff of the Carnegie Library in Pittsburgh located a very brief funeral notice indicating that John M. Agy, husband of Susan Morford Agy, had died on Monday, 30 November 1908, in ' his 78th year. "Funeral services were held at his late residence, 1012 Cabinet street, North Side, on Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment private." The place of burial was not mentioned; thus we are unable to know where to write to learn where Susan's grave is. The last directory listing of the widow was in 1910, and showed her living at 1012 Cassidy Street. She may have died soon; or at the age of 77 may have been living with one of her children or in a rest home, thus would not be individually listed in the directory. The vital statistics department declined to search '17or her death records without charging a staggering fee. Too bad, as with a specific death date we could check to see if her obituary provided more information as to her history and survivors.

We did some of this ourselves, and plan to check related non-Morford names next time we're in Salt Lake City WILLIS and GAYLE MORFORD, en route to Florida from Minnesota, stopped at North Liberty, Iowa, to visit ARCH & VIVIAN MORFORD; while there they made a transcript of a family Bible which had been presented to Anna C. Morford on her 56th birthday, in March 1889, by her husband, John T. Morford. Many of the entries helped to complete our records of family members. We have asked Arch & Vivian to send us a xerox of the Bible's

title page, as this is important in showing when the records were begun. The chain of ownership of a Bible should also be noted -- not-always does this family treasure go to the eldest child, because often it's a younger one who shows interest in the family records. Frequent letters from VIOLA MOFFORD NEEB, MARY JANE STEINHAGEN and many others add treasures of data which augment our knowledge of many family branches, or which furnish additional clues to be pursued in identifying various Morfords.... Many of our subscribers, in sending in their renewals, have added a bit more to their checks for the "research kitty". We'll report more on this in our next Historian By the way, you ladies who are descendants of John Morford [1758-1840] -- don't forget that you're eligible to join the D.A.R. based on your ancestor's services; and of course the male descendants may become members of S.A.R. , too. We hope to find more complete records of several other Morfords who served in the Revolutionary War, so that their descendants, too, may join these patriotic societies In the next issue we hope to have an interesting discussion on the Morford name, and the many variations in which we find it spelled. . . .
